

Shaanxi Province

- Shaanxi is considered one of the cradles of Chinese civilization
- Thirteen feudal dynasties established their capitals in the province during a span of more than 1,100 years, from the Zhou Dynasty to the Tang Dynasty
- The province's principal city and current capital, <u>Xi'an</u>, is one of the <u>four great ancient capitals of</u> <u>China</u> and is the eastern terminus of the <u>Silk</u> <u>Road</u>, which leads to Europe, the Arabian Peninsula and Africa.

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Northwestern Polytechnical University (also known as NPU or NWPU; Chinese: 西北工业大学; pinyin: *XIběi Göngyè Dàxué*; Russian: Северо-западный политехнический университет) is a National Key University, directed by the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology of the People's Republic of China, located in Xi'an, Shaanxi, China. The university emphasizes on the education and research in aeronautical, astronautical and marine engineering. In February 2012, NPU has 13,736 graduate students (3,063 full-time doctorate candidates, 7,087 master candidates, 3,586 professional degree candidates) and 14,395 undergraduate students.^[1]

The current NPU enjoys the legacy from its three major predecessors.^[2] **Northwestern Engineering Institute**

- In 1938, due to the Japanese invasion in the northwestern China, many institutes were relocated to Shaanxi. Among them, the <u>National</u> <u>Beiyang Engineering Institute</u>, the Engineering School of <u>Beiping</u> <u>University</u>, the Engineering School of the <u>National Northeastern</u> <u>University</u>, and the (private) <u>Jiaozuo Engineering Institute</u> were combined and formed the former <u>National Northwestern Engineering</u> <u>Institute</u> in <u>Hanzhong</u>, <u>Shaanxi</u>, which is a city surrounded by mountain range
- After the <u>World War II</u>, the <u>National Northwestern Engineering</u> <u>Institute</u>, which is one of the three predecessors of the later NPU, was moved out of the mountains into the city of <u>Xianyang</u> in 1946. After the <u>People's Republic of China</u> founded, the <u>National</u> <u>Northwestern Engineering Institute</u> was renamed as the <u>Northwestern Engineering Institute</u> (because all the institute had become state-owned) in 1950.

Eastern China Aeronautics Institute

- In 1952, due to the need of concentrated aeronautics research, the departments of aeronautical engineering of the former <u>National Central University</u> (later known as the <u>Nanjing University</u>), <u>Jiaotong University</u> and <u>Zhejiang</u> <u>University</u> are relocated to <u>Nanjing</u> and established the <u>Eastern China Aeronautics Institute</u>. This institute was relocated to Xi'an and renamed as the <u>Xi'an Aeronautics</u> <u>Institute</u>, which is the second predecessor of the later NPU, in 1956.
- In 1957, the <u>Northwestern Engineering Institute</u> and the <u>Xi'an Aeronautics Institute</u> were merged to form the NPU, which concentrated its research in defense research in aeronautics, astronautics and marine engineering.

People's Liberation Army Military Engineering Institute

- In 1970, due to the deteriorating relation with former <u>USSR</u>, the <u>People's Liberation Army</u> <u>Military Engineering Institute</u>, which was located in <u>Harbin</u>, was disassembled
- Many of its departments were relocated from the city near China-Soviet border, among which, its Department of Aeronautical Engineering (the last predecessor of NWPU) is moved to Xi'an and merged into the NPU.





PUBLIC AND RESERVE GARDENS. REGULATIONS. 1. The Gardens are reserved for the Foreign Community. 2. The Gardens are opened daily to the public from 6 a.m. and will be closed half an hour after midnight. 3. No persons are admitted unless respectably dressed. 4. Dogs and bicycles are not admitted. 5. Perambulators must be confined to the paths. 6. Birdnesting, plucking flowers, climbing trees or damaging the trees, shrubs, or grass is strictly prohibited; visitors and others in charge of children are requested to aid in preventing such mischief. 7. No person is allowed within the band stand enclosure. 8. Amahs in charge of children are not permitted to occupy the seats and chairs during band performances 9. Children unaccompanied by foreigners are not allowed in Reserve Garden. 10. The police have instructions to enforce these regulat ions. By Order, N. O. Liddell. Secretary. Council Room, Shanghai, Sept. 13th. 1917.
